1. Aging, Risk Factors for Stroke, Cerebrovascular Disease and Dementia:
This cross sequential longitudinal study has been going on over the last twenty years at this laboratory to study the risk factors for stroke, and their control on cerebral changes, cognitive decline and dementia. This is both natural history study and later interventional study once risk factors for Mild Cognitive Impairment (MCI), Vascular Cognitive Impairment (VCI), Parkinson's Disease Dementia (PDD), Dementia of Alzheimer's Type (DAT), Vascular Dementia (VaD) and Mixtures of DAT and VaD (MIX) have been established. Many patients with MCI, VCI, PDD, DAT, and VaD have been identified, treated, and cases published. More than 90 research papers have been published in distinguished peer-reviewed journals including two textbooks on Vascular Dementia describing different outcomes of the study.
